



## HUNGER FREE COMMUNITIES INITIATIVE

### The Challenge

Food insecurity in the United States remains a significant issue with USDA indicating 47.4 million people live in food-insecure households, including 13.8 million children. These households, struggling with inadequate access to and resources for needed food may turn to federal nutrition programs and community food resources to help put food on the table. Recent data demonstrate over 42 million people participate in the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (USDA) and approximately 49 million people receive charitable food assistance (Feeding America) at some point during the year. Unfortunately, hardship has been increasing since the end of pandemic-era supports.

Hunger in America is a condition of the lack of public and political will; it persists not because we lack the resources to end it, but because we lack a shared understanding of the problem, and the leadership and resolve to address it. True progress against hunger requires cooperation among elected leaders, program administrators, private enterprise, and nonprofit organizations at the national, state and local levels.

### The Vision

Guided by the experience of Ambassador Tony Hall's work as a Member of Congress from Ohio, the Alliance to End Hunger's [\*Hunger Free Communities Initiative\*](#) supports multi-sector collaborations seeking to assess and address the unique needs of those experiencing hunger in their communities. These coalitions—comprised of nonprofit, government, faith and private sectors—range in scale from small towns and counties, to major metropolitan areas and states. Some are led by Members of Congress, governors and mayors, while others are entirely volunteer driven. At their core, these initiatives are formed around the belief that to end hunger at the local level a broad range of community stakeholders must unite behind a common vision and strategy.

The *Hunger Free Communities Network™* is a forum for information sharing, resource development and capacity building. Bringing the Alliance to End Hunger's track record of brokering diverse partnerships to the local level, we support the network to better understand hunger in their communities and identify innovative solutions which address underserved populations, engage communities and promote equitable policy solutions. We invest in this network by providing multiple platforms that foster communication between anti-hunger coalitions and the sharing of best practices, including the Hunger Free Communities Summit.

The Alliance to End Hunger is helping Hunger Free Communities develop a foundation of public will—in communities and in Congress—to make a lasting impact in the lives of hungry people.

### The Impact

Hunger Free Communities, which were championed by elected leaders, led by community stakeholders, and supported by the Alliance to End Hunger, have led to:

- Deeper understanding of hunger in our communities and among our political leaders
- Greater capacity and better coordination of emergency food programs
- Improved access to and enrollment in public nutrition programs
